President's Report 2018/2019

2019 was an incredibly busy year at Hectorville Sports & Community Club.

In November of 2018, an almost entirely brand new Board of Management was elected and got straight to work to undertake the daunting task of operating a club that was carrying some serious debt, with limited available funds and very little cash flow.

Firstly, I wish to personally thank the 2019 Board of Management members (in no particular order) Sandra Di Blasio, Rocco Musolino, Fergus Grant, Bill Leo, Christian McCormack, Kurt Opray, Mark Leckie, Cat Rugari, Patrick Ritchie & Mick Seager for their considerable efforts and support throughout the last 12 months.

Financial Stability

The Board's primary focus for the majority of the year was to promote a cost saving approach to everything we did so that we could pull ourselves out of the financial situation the club found itself in. This included negotiating delayed repayments on several long outstanding trade creditors, renegotiating the 'Oval Hire' fees for a 2 year period, agreeing to a minimum 50/50 volunteer model across the club, and searching for lower cost food and drink suppliers.

Of course cost savings is only one half of the equation, we also needed to increase revenue. We held several very successful fundraising events throughout the year and primarily with the support of our football families were able to generate solid Kitchen/Bar/Canteen revenue numbers week on week.

Solar panel debt has also been fully paid down.

One Club Vision

Our vision as a board was to create a simplified operating model where all sporting sections would equally contribute to the financial success of the club and therefore equally benefit from that success. The previous model of sporting sections essentially acting independently, not sharing membership information, not discussing/sharing sponsorship opportunities, not sharing fundraising activities, and hoarding money at the peril of the overarching sporting club in our opinion is an unsustainable model. The previous years' financial results showed this to be true.

Change is difficult. Humans (in general) typically don't like change. However, for the future of the club, we simply have to change. The opportunity for success that we have at Hectorville Sports & Community Club is simply too good to ignore.

Clubroom Redevelopment

Following on from the successful State Government grant application in 2018, we were fortunate enough to be a successful applicant in the Federal Government Community Sport Infrastructure grant, being awarded the full \$500K allocation to contribute to the redevelopment of our aging clubrooms in order to meet the requirements of the growing playing base, particularly the female playing group. This, along with the \$270K State Government Grant from 2018 was enough to sway the Campbelltown Council to move forward with the clubroom redevelopment plans and commit to topping up the budget to a \$3M redevelopment.

Early in 2019 Council architects, Design Inc. were engaged by Campbelltown Council to provide some concept plans to retain the structural shell of the existing building, and extend/renovate to provide the necessary facilities to meet the requirements of the grant. The development sub-committee

then worked through these plans to achieve everything that would make the clubrooms useable by all members of the community for a long time into the future. This included;

- 4 x AFL compliant unisex change rooms
- 2 x AFL compliant umpire change rooms
- Refit of the existing Council external toilets
- New fully glazed canteen and café area
- Upstairs toilets
- New Kitchen & Bar facilities
- Larger 200 seat venue
- Multi-purpose committee/function room
- Large balconies both East & West facing (with a new 2nd story balcony overlooking Tennis/Netball courts)

The first round of tenders unfortunately saw every shortlisted contractor come in over budget in the range of \$350-\$500K. At the Council meeting held on 19th November 2019, a decision was passed to endorse Sarah Constructions as the preferred contractor and to extend the Council's funding a further \$350K to cover the additional budgetary requirements.

We will now meet with Council and Sarah Constructions to develop a workable project plan which will factor in loss of facilities, trade and alternative facility arrangements. Work is now expected to commence early in 2020.

Continued Membership Growth

The old business adage of "If you aren't moving forward, you are going backwards" is really important to consider with a club like Hectorville. Each and every sporting section must continue to look at opportunities to grow their playing membership base, year on year. This not only increases the revenue the sporting section contributes to the club, long term however, it will increase the revenue of the entire club as more members start to utilise our new facilities more regularly.

With our centralised marketing team now fully active, we are encouraging the sporting sections to engage regularly to take advantage of the reach we now have including participation cross promotion between sections.

Passing of Beloved Club Members

It was with great sadness that we had to say goodbye to some of our most beloved club members throughout 2019. Each and every one of these people contributed a great deal to the Hectorville Sports & Community Club in some capacity over the years and all will be greatly missed.

2019 AGM - HSCC Treasurer Report

This past 12 months has been one of an incredible level of change. Having the 2018 AGM finish the year with a \$54k operating loss, the Board knew some hard decisions needed to be made to keep the Club afloat and has executed these. The past two Treasurer's Reports referred to the poor cash flow positions and the fact that the position was not sustainable.

It was imperative that the Club worked together with its sport groups to be the one Club it was set up to be. The Club reduced its reliance on overdraft which was nearly at its maximum and has improved cash flow. Through discussion with the sporting sections, cash injections were fundamental to the Club's ability to meet debts as they fell due. Thank you to Tennis who gave \$5,000 and Football who provided in excess of \$30,000.

Some key changes which were drivers in reducing our financial pressures included –

- Increased scrutiny applied to vendors and suppliers
- Increased significantly the number of volunteer hours in key roles in the kitchen and bar versus previously paid positions
- Streamlined kitchen procedures allowing for better management of a roster for chefs and kitchen staff
- Reducing stock holdings and buying on a need basis only
- Entered into payment arrangements with some of the more significant creditors to smooth out cash flow over the year
- Increased sponsorship improved the overall offerings and presented a professional product

Highlights for 2018-19

- Turnaround in operating profit of \$117 462 from -\$54 733 (loss) to +\$62 729.
- 40.4% reduction in wages (saving of \$50 730 achieved through a volunteer drive).
- 21.7% reduction in kitchen and bar purchases (food, alcohol and soft drinks) from \$145 834 in 2018 to \$114 210 in 2019, a saving of \$31 624 achieved via more diligent purchasing.

What's coming in 2019-2020?

Plans for the next 12 months include continuation of the above as well as introducing a new governance model and finalising implementations of the 'one club' model we as a Board agreed upon in February 2019. We need to be to maximise opportunity and potential. Some developments to come include –

- Consolidate our business 1 club run as one entity which delivers 5 sports to the community
- Continue to develop the governance model supported by a new constitution which is out of date
- Consolidate our player and member profiles to maximise exposure for sponsorship and marketing opportunities

Junior Football Report

2019 was another very successful year for Junior Football both on and off the field.

On Field

16 Teams were fielded ranging from U7's to U16.5's (12 Boys teams and 4 Girls teams). Premiership success in 2018 for the U12's and U13's saw them both move into higher Divisions in 2019 and still be competitive. The U14 and U16 Girls were both elevated to Division 1 and the U12 Girls narrowly missed out on a Grand Final appearance. 4 of the 7 Premiership sides made Finals (U12, U15, U16.5, U16 Girls) with the U12 and U15 Boys 2019 Premiership Winners.

In addition to the growth in overall numbers, Hectorville Junior Football Club continues to see many more players looking to transfer to Hectorville from other Clubs than we see transferring out. We have already had 7 requests this November to transfer to Hectorville. This is a great sign that players and families are embracing and valuing the environment being created at the Hectorville football Club.

Individual highlights included Anthony Mustaca winning the SANFL U13's Division 2 Junior Medal along with being the age groups leading goal kicker. Sam Hughes (U12 Div 3) and Angus Turner (U15 Div 3) finished 2nd and 3rd respectively in their age groups medal count- a great effort considering both players missed a significant number of games during the season.

Auskick

Hectorville continues to have record numbers of Auskickers with 60 plus players taking part in 2019. A huge thankyou to Simon Perrin and his helpers who ran a wonderfully well organised Auskick program. Auskick has been a terrific introduction to Football and the Hectorville Sports Club for these new players and their families.

Summer Football

Summer Football Clinics have been run again in Term 4. This 7 week program was very well attended with record numbers of over 120 boys and girls taking part. Many of these players are new to football and will play for Hectorville in 2020- a great outcome. Thank you to the Norwood Football Club who continue to support Hectorville whenever we ask. This year we have had Senior Norwood Women spend 2 weeks helping out with Girls Summer Footy Clinics. Summer Footy is another important point of difference at the Hectorville Football Club- thank you to all the Coaches and helpers who made it work so well in 2019.

Coaching Coordinator

This role is something the Football Club has wanted to have in place for some time. An enormously important role, it was filled by Paul Rhigas in 2019. Paul brought a level of passion, enthusiasm, professionalism and organisation to the role that saw Junior Football benefit greatly. I thank Paul for all he has done for the Club in 2019 and beyond.

Coaches

Coaches are the backbone of Junior Football. We had a very dedicated group of Coaches in 2019 and I would like to thank them, along with their Team Managers and those in support roles, for their dedication to Junior Football at Hectorville. As a Club we will continue to develop and support Coaches as they are such an important factor in what experience players and families have at the Hectorville Football Club.

Social Activities for Juniors

As part of our vision to always improve on and off the field we have encouraged each team to have a team bonding social experience outside of football. This was new in 2019 and seemed to work well with teams taking part in activities such as Tree Climb, a Swimming Day and Escape Room.

The Junior Disco was well attended by the younger age groups and was a lot of fun. The Quiz Night was a sell-out, raised money and was a great way for families to socialise.

Junior Teams took part in halftime games at Norwood Oval and Adelaide Oval in 2019.

Girls Footy

Hectorville Football Club is very proud of the Girls Football Program it has developed in only 3 seasons. This year saw record numbers of Girls playing at Hectorville. Having both the U14 and U16 Girls playing in Division one and the U12's narrowly missing out on a Grand Final appearance shows how far Girls Football has come in a short time. 2020 will see the introduction of an U18's team for the first time at Hectorville. 2021 will see a Women's Team take the field for Hectorville. By then Hectorville should have in excess of 140 Female Players.

The inaugural U16 Girls Footy Trip took place post season this year. A huge success with 25 players making the trip to Melbourne to play the Vermont Eagles, this trip was an amazing bonding experience for all involved. Thank you to Peter Turner for all his efforts in organising what I think will be an important link with his old Club, the Vermont Football Club. Vermont are looking to reciprocate with a trip to SA in 2020 to play the U16 Hectorville Girls. This relationship should then continue meaning all girls at Hectorville can look forward to an interstate football trip when they play U16 Girls footy at Heccies. A special thank you to Bill Leo for all the time and effort he put in to making this trip a reality.

Summary

With the enormous growth in player numbers in the past few years, and a committed and talented group of Coaches and volunteers, Hectorville Football Club is very well placed for the future. The upgraded change rooms, a continued focus on Coach and player development along with all families feeling they are a part of a special place in the Hectorville Sports Club Community makes for some exciting times ahead!

Junior Netball Report

2019 was my first year as Junior Coordinator I was given great support by the netball club as a whole and in particular by Sam McGrath, Mick Seager and Amanda Marciniak. There are three seasons that started and/or ended in 2019 I will give a short synopsis of each followed by more general information on this year in netball.

Summer 2018/19: Sam's last season as coordinator had 9 teams competing, 4 in Junior, 3 in Sub-Junior and 2 in Primary. Junior 1 and Junior 2 teams won their Grand Finals. Sub-Junior 2 finished first on the ladder and made the GF but just fell short. Primary 1 – finished first on the ladder, there are no finals in the Primary age group. At the end of the season 4 team's worth of junior players moved to Senior.

Winter 2019: My first full season as co-ordinator. Had 6 teams competing, 1 in Junior, 3 in Sub-Junior and 2 in Primary. Considering we lost 4 teams worth of players to Senior we made up a whole new team's worth of players in new recruits. The junior team made the prelim finals as did the Sub-Junior 1 and 3 teams. Within Primary the teams had tough seasons but made solid progress.

Summer 2019/20: This summer we have 7 teams competing. So we have made another teams worth of players back. Two teams in Junior, 3 in Sub-Junior and 2 in Primary.

Trials and registrations: I am sending more regular e-mail communications to parents regarding registration and trials. So far I have received good feedback regarding this new initiative and will continue its use. I have learned that trying to forecast numbers to plan trials is futile because people leave it so late to register often not doing it until the day of trials or at trials itself — despite regular communication to existing player's parents. I'd like to thank the following who have helped me prepare and/or run trials; Paige McGrath, Bethany McGrath, Claire Jones, Kirsten Nield, Katherine Balfour, Hope Seager, Amanda Marciniak, Leanne Shirlock, Vicki Best, Steve Miles, Sue Pace, Mick Seager and Ashley Gibson.

Player numbers: We are currently on an upward trajectory in player numbers. It is important to try and keep getting the girls at primary age, this is the age group we get the most new players in. However it does ebb and flow. Some schools don't play summer so we get players join us then and leave again in winter – if we can get the players before they settle into a school team this may boost numbers further in future. Trying to advertise more in local primary schools is something I'm looking in to.

I'd like to thank the netball board and all the coaches who give up their time to make sure we can keep offering young people in our community the chance to play netball
